Grade nine beginners

Grade nines in beginner instrumental music have the opportunity to play the following instruments:

- Flute
- Oboe
- Clarinet
- Bass Clarinet
- Saxophone (Alto, Tenor, Baritone)
- Trumpet
- Trombone
- Euphonium
- French Horn
- Bassoon
- Tuba
- Percussion

Please Note:

All music students are required to participate in one performance ensemble. For grade 9 students, they will be required to participate in Junior Concert Band which one early morning a week at 8am. Attendance at band practices and the concert is worth 5% of the student`s final mark.

What course should I take?

AMI101- Beginner music, no experience necessary. We teach you how to read music and play an instrument.

AMI102- Experienced music: have already played one of the instruments in a concert band, flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, French horn, euphonium, tuba or percussion for at least one year.

What happens if I cannot fit it into my grade 9 schedule?

If you happen to be in French Immersion or have some other course conflicts, it does not mean you cannot start music later. We have a grade 10 beginner course too! AMU201
