

Academic Level aims to:

- ☐ Teach essential concepts of a subject and explores related material
- ☐ Help you practice independent study skills
- ☐ Develop your critical and abstract thought
- ☐ Prepare you for future learning at the academic and/or university level

DESTREAMED ENGLISH

Will help you:

- ☐ Strengthen your study skills
- ☐ Clarify and gain greater understanding about your future level of study
- ☐ Provide you an opportunity to improve your reading, writing skills, and oral communication skills

WHY ARE COURSES BEING DE-STREAMED?



Research shows that de-streaming results in better outcomes for students and particularly for those who are from marginalized communities

- ☐ It creates more post-secondary opportunities and exploration for all students
- ☐ Gives students increased opportunity to enhance study skills for success at the post-secondary level



ACADEMIC VS DE-STREAMED WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE?

Although there have been curriculum adjustments to Science, English, and Math and a change in course code ...there is no difference!

- ☐ All students will follow the same program of study
- ☐ Provides opportunity for students to make informed decisions about future pathway option for post-secondary studies

LOCALLY DEVELOPED COURSES

Students are <u>recommended</u>* for Locally Developed Courses if:

- ☐ They may be working on significantly modified curriculum expectations in Gr 7 & 8
- ☐ They are not yet working at grade level and require significant support

*Consultation with both Gr 8 teacher and Core Resource

ULTIMATE POTENTIAL (U.P.) MATH

What is UP Math?

- U.P. Math is a remedial program that helps close the gaps in Math for students who are very close to becoming a strong Level 2 Math student
- Students are identified by the teacher and core resource

How do I select UP Math?

- Students choose courses on myBlueprint, submit completed registration form, and have timetable adjusted by Guidance at a later date.
- Complete the Up Math Registration Form and return to your Gr 8 teacher
- ☐ The UP Math course will replace one of your 8 courses in Grade 9; it will be scheduled in Sem 1, and then Math will be scheduled in Sem 2




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


CHOOSING YOUR ELECTIVE & ALTERNATE

- 3. ENSURE it's a Grade 9 course




