Step 1: Research Your University Options

- Visit OUInfo (<u>www.ontariouniversitiesinfo.ca</u>) to find what each university has to offer.
- Read the **Undergraduate Application Guide** (available at www.ouac.on.ca/undergrad-guide) for up-to-date information about universities and programs.
- Check out university publications and websites.
- Talk to counsellors, family, teachers and friends.
- Write down your program choices and codes and keep them handy.





Search for your ideal program and find out the information you need to apply, like prerequisites, grade requirements and more. Plus, compare your choices.

Get to know Ontario's universities and where they are located. Find out information about campus visits, residence costs and more!



How to Apply

Which application is right for me? Answer a few statements to guide you to the proper undergraduate application.

Basics to Remember When Researching:

- Supplemental Applications criteria and deadlines
- Applying early? deadline for SA will be same for everyone (i.e., two weeks from submission) and some dates may vary...please check with your schools/programs of choice, some profiles may also be required through student portals, ie., SOLUS through Queen's

Step 2: Get Your OEN

You will need your Ontario Education Number (OEN) to apply.

The OEN is a 9-digit, unique identification number assigned to elementary and high school students across the province.

You can find your OEN on your report card and/or status sheet (distributed to all Grade 12s in September). Your high school guidance counsellor will also have it on record.

Step 3: Mark Your Calendar

- Late September 2023: The Undergraduate Application opens.
- January 15, 2024: Deadline to submit your completed application to the OUAC.
- May 29, 2024: Last day you can expect a response from an Ontario university if you applied by the January 15 deadline.
- June 3, 2024: The earliest day you may be required to respond to an offer and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration or residence deposit).

The OUAC cannot process your application without the application fee.

Submitting Your Application

- On the Complete page, print the screen displaying your OUAC Reference Number (2024-XXXXXX) and instructions. You will also receive an email.
- Record your OUAC Reference Number, as you will need to include it when communicating with the OUAC and the universities.

What Now?

- · You will receive an email with your confirmation number that outlines your next steps.

Out of Province Universities

- Some schools have partnership with OUAC and will ask for your OUAC reference # in the application.
- Please follow school's guidelines for applying to any school outside of Ontario
- Typically, transcripts/marks will be the responsibility of the student

Applying to Out-of-province Universities


The OUAC assists the following out-of-province universities with collecting academic data for Ontario high school students who have applied through the OUAC:

- Acadia University
- Bishop's University
- · The University of British Columbia
- University of Calgary
- Concordia University
- · Dalhousie University
- McGill University
- Saint Mary's University
- · Simon Fraser University
- The University of Victoria

Students who apply to these out-of-province universities can authorize the universities to request their academic information from the OUAC. To authorize them, the applicant must include their 11-digit OUAC Reference Number on the university's application form.

In all cases, the 11th digit should be "0".

Scholarships

 There are two types of scholarships: entrance and application-driven

Scholarships requiring application:

- Will require community involvement and other accomplishments
- Will have an academic component
- May ask for references (give your reference the courtesy of at least one week to complete)

Scholarships

- Check Edsby posts for various scholarship opportunities, <u>few</u> require school nomination
- Check the Scholarship Report (electronic subscription compiling several awards during a 1-2 month period
- Check various web resources (see Edbsy post)

Entrance Scholarships

 Award will be granted with offer of admission, based on marks only and can only increase Black Foundation of Community Networks (BFCN)
