Considering applying to University in Ontario?

General admission to university in Ontario requires students to apply with six Grade 12 U/M level courses. In general, one course must be ENG4U1 and the other five courses are dictated by the program of choice. There are always exceptions to the general rule, so it is imperative for students to check the program websites for their schools of choice.

There are also several programs that may require supplemental applications and/or non-academic items.

These supplementals will have their own criteria and deadlines.

Considering applying to College in Ontario?

General admission to college in Ontario requires students to have their OSSD and ENG4U/C. In general, students must have ENG4C/U and have successfully completed their OSSD requirements. There are some programs that may have specific course requirements and/or supplemental application items required for consideration.

Highly Competitive Programs: Students must apply by the general application deadline.

General Application Deadline: February 1

Considering an Apprenticeship?

Most apprenticeships will require the student to find an employer registered with the Ministry of Colleges and Universities (MTCU), and will engage in an educational platform through their employer. There are very few true apprenticeship programs in Ontario colleges direct out of high school, but students can take pre-Apprenticeship programs in the Skilled Trades.
