APPRENTICESHIP

FEATURES

- Pay while you learn
- On the job training/learning
- Application completed with employer
- Some prerequisites are trade specific

TIMELINES

- Typically occurs after high school
- Student finds employer or may apply direct to some college programs
- Opportunity for OYAP program to begin training

CERTIFICATE (1 YR),
DIPLOMA (2YR),
DEGREE (4YR),

ADVANCED DIPLOMA (3YR),
GRAD CERT (1 YR, POST-GRAD)

FEATURES

- Industry-driven programs, job specific skills
- Gr 11 & 12 C/M/U courses for admission, ENG4C/U
- Non-academic criteria often required

TIMELINES

- February 1st deadline to apply
- Accept your offer by May 1st
- \$95 fee for five program choices through OCAS

- Attend Post-Secondary Fair on Oct 17th
- College Workshops late November

COLLEGE: POINTS TO REMEMBER

- Apply to competitive programs by Feb 1st
- Grade 11 marks will be used by colleges to determine offers of admission
- Some programs have additional requirements
- Marks will be sent electronically by the school for all students registered in high school

FEATURES

- ❑ 6 Gr 12 U/M level courses, must include ENG4U
- ❑ Some programs may require additional criteria

TIMELINES

- ❑ January 15, 2020 deadline to apply
- ❑ \$150 for three program choices through OUAC 101 app, \$50 for each additional choice, extra fees may apply
- ❑ Accept offer by June 1st

UNIVERSITY: POINTS TO REMEMBER

- Competitive averages and the admission score
- Early acceptance
- Marks will be submitted electronically by the school for any student registered in high school
- Any courses taken privately (Blyth, Sharp Minds, etc) will be flagged on official transcript as “private”
- Students taking courses outside of our Board at night school or privately must provide Proof of registration and midterm/final grade reporting to Guidance

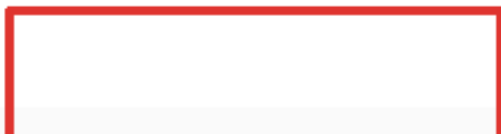
